- Techniques: Pinch stitch, ssamsol, running stitch ssamsol
- Specific skills: Ribbon, bat knot
- Fabrics: Natural ramie, unbleached ramie, semi-bleached ramie, coloured ramie

<p>Lotus Leaf Bojagi</p>	<p>Using pinch stitch and whip stitching method to create leaf shaped bojagi. Shapes can be modified to make it more suitable for its usage</p>	
<p>Ramie Jogakbal</p>	<p>Jogakbal made using running stitch and can be seen through. Materials include natural ramie, unbleached ramie, semi-bleached ramie which add to its naturalistic design</p>	
<p>Ramie Pinch Stitch Jogakbo</p>	<p>This jogakbo is created by using both pinch stitch and ssamsol. Harmonises the traditional curve patterns and straight lines</p>	

- **Ssamsol (Flat-felled Seam)** Ssamsol is used for single-layered bojagi or patchwork covering cloth. When making one layered jogakbo, ssamsol is the most effective method used to prevent fabrics from fraying. Ssamsol helps the seamline sturdy while looking thin. After stitching the seamline, one side of the seam allowance is cut off, then the longer margin is pressed from above and stitched to cover the remaining narrow margin
